Call to Order

Chair Tilandra Rhyne called the meeting to order at 1:02 p.m.

Constituent Concerns

- **Our role:** The Academic Services Council is to consider discussions on academic support programs including assessment centers, labs, registration, scheduling, website information, and transfer and articulation agreements, and forward suggestions to the College Council, the Senior Vice Presidents or other councils, as appropriate, for further consideration and/or action.
- Constituent Concerns
 - A group of Rockville biology faculty brought to the College Council concerns that on at least two different occasions, students have used paid services to take online exams for them. These faculty also provided information for three such companies. Dr. Mills went on one of these websites and someone at the company walked him through the entire process of how their service works. Upon review of the Examyty recording of one of these students' exams, it was clear that 20 minutes into the exam an external user took control of the student's computer. This issue has been assigned to the Academic Services Council and we will bring it up with Guillermo Laya when he comes to our April meeting.

Blackboard Learn Ultra – Dr. Paul Miller, Director, ELITE Professional Development

- Blackboard Learn Original is upgrading to Blackboard Learn Ultra
- Blackboard has been developing Learn Ultra for the past 7 years – now they are focusing entirely on Learn Ultra, so MC is making the upgrade
- Blackboard Mobile has been running mostly on Learn Ultra
- Three phase transition period: <https://mcblogs.montgomerycollege.edu/thehub/stay-connected/blackboard-learn-ultra/>
 - Phase 1: Internal Capacity Building (Spring 2024 – Summer 2024)
 - ELITE internal training to develop training for faculty
 - First Movers – early adopters
 - Early Bird training for Ultra and open labs the week of graduation
 - Phase 2: Training and Resource Deployment (Fall 2024)
 - Courses can be transitioned one at a time
 - Ultra training for all faculty will be available starting in Professional Week August 2024
 - All new faculty starting in summer 2024 will only be trained on Ultra (not Digital Fundamentals)
 - Phase 3: Intensive Training and Support (Spring 2025 – Summer 2025)
 - Weekly trainings in Spring 2025
 - All courses will be in Ultra by Fall 2025
- Goal is not to completely rebuild a course in Ultra but to convert as much as possible

- Some changes and nuances will require more work to convert, for example, the layer of files in Ultra is only up to 3 whereas it was unlimited in Original
- Start training early and work with ELITE to make the conversion process as smooth as possible
- Will Ultra be able to apply accommodations for students across all assessments instead of requiring the faculty to set it up for each assessment?
 - Paul will look into this use case and report back
- How does Ultra compare with Microsoft Teams?
 - The new Ultra interface is much more student user friendly
 - Blackboard would be more of a common experience for students
- Organizations and Blackboard Communities are not being converted now
 - Even when we stop using Original all courses and communities will still be available to copy at a later date
- Ultra is more faculty user-friendly and simpler to use
 - There will be a slight learning curve
 - Ultra is much more like Canvas, more friendly, have better aesthetics, and more intuitive to use
- Questions and exams should be able to convert over to Ultra
- Navigation in Ultra will be across the top instead of down the side
- Ultra has embedded AI functions – to create modules, for example
- Blackboard support and ELITE professional development team are available to help with the transition

Goal Plan Review

- Signage and postings have increased on the west side of the TPSS campus to advertise pantries and other resources, and locations of printers
- How might we advocate for communication systems and the use of technology to better reach students?
 - Predictive texting
 - Chatbox integration on our website
 - Popups of suggested links on our website
 - We can address this in our May meeting with the Student Affairs representatives from all three campuses
- Conversations with lab managers about posting resources in their labs
- Engaging with Student Council in this conversation
 - Student Council membership is made up for Student Government representatives from all three campuses
- Student Insider's Guide
 - Post link on Blackboard
 - Share with department chairs to share with faculty
- Invite John Hamman to our meeting to explore data on student access to resources
- Jojo's students working on the registration website plans to have it ready for testing by next Friday, April 5

- We can invite the students to join our April or May meeting to demonstrate their work
