NOTES: Minimum of 120 credits, including 30 with UMGC of which at least 15 must be upper-level (courses numbered 300-499), are required for the bachelor's degree with a UMGC grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 (C) or higher / At least one-half of the credits within the major and minor must be comprised of: a. traditional college courses earning a grade (except for the CJLE major); b. UMGC resident coursework (except for the APTC, CJLE, and GECU majors, which require only the major capstone as UMGC resident credit) / No course within the major or minor below the grade of C (2.0) / UMGC does not accept grades below a C (2.0) in transfer from schools outside of the University System of Maryland and the Maryland community colleges (except WRTG 112 which must be completed with a grade of C- (1.67) or better from all schools) / Maximum of 70 transfer credits to UMGC from two-year or community colleges & maximum of 90 transfer credits from all sources combined (actual number of transfer credits dependent on meeting all UMGC bachelor's degree requirements) / ◆¹ = Course in major at UMGC / *² = Lower-level course meets content requirement of upper-level course but does not transfer as upper-level / UL³ = Upper-level course (numbered 300-499)
