



Dual Enrollment



WHAT IS DUAL ENROLLMENT?

- Dual Enrollment is an MC academic initiative that allows qualified high school students to be admitted and enrolled at Montgomery College, taking credit courses while earning their high school diploma.
- Students are registered for standard college courses taught by Montgomery College professors.
- Students may take advantage of individual *College and career credit pathways* or apply for a *degree completion program*.
- DE is not a high school program, it is a college program for high school students.



MC DUAL ENROLLMENT MONTGOMERY COLLEGE

Jumpstart To College

- Students are enrolled in individual credit courses.
- May choose a pathway towards a degree that can be completed after HS graduation.
- May take courses to earn a career-based college certificate.
- Available to all MCPS, private, homeschool and out-of-county students

Early College

- Campus-based degree program
- Students are admitted after 10th grade
- Students are full-time at MC for their junior and senior year of HS.
- Students take college courses that to earn their diploma and degree

Middle College

- HS-based degree program at Northwood, Northwest, Clarksburg (P-TECH/P-TEACH) or Virtual Middle College (VMC)
- Students are admitted by 9th grade and progressively enrolled at MC through 12th grade
- Students take college (MC) and high school (AP etc.) courses to earn their diploma and degree

Course Scheduling

- Course requests will come from DE Office
- Chairs will identify and assign a professor to teach each course section.
- Department will order and assign textbooks to be made available at the Bookstore. DIGITAL WHEN AVAILABLE
- Sections do not show on public schedule unless authorized
 - Your dept. can find in Qlickview (check section number or text)
 - Courses may be identified as “off campus”
 - Scheduled based on proximity to school.
- Online/Campus based courses can enroll general students after DE registers with department approval.

Background Check/ Training for Instructors:

- STATE MANDATED for all courses offered at HS site
- Background screening and fingerprinting through MCPS
- Complete the online child abuse training for working with minors through Compliance (MC Learns)
- This process must be complete before instructors can be allowed to teach at school
 - Be sure to complete these tasks early! (Takes 1-2 weeks)
- Instructors can obtain a MCPS badge to enter school without signing in.

Courses offered at High School Site/USG

- Follows DE MC/MCPS calendar
 - Courses typically begin in week two
- Will be scheduled by DE office
- Faculty will have an MC point of contact
- Faculty will receive detailed school info.
- DE office provides local travel reimbursement through accounts payable

DUAL ENROLLMENT ACADEMIC CALENDAR:

The MC academic calendar differs from MCPS's academic calendar for off-site courses only.

- MC classes held at the high schools may observe MCPS and MC days off and observe both spring breaks.
- MC classes held on MC campuses or through distance learning observe MC days off, not MCPS days off.
 - MCAP (state exams) AP, SAT and PSAT dates are set nationally and students must test during those times, even if they must miss an MC class day.
- P-TECH classes at GT observe both MCPS and MC days off.


